Until very eve of rising, expressions of loyalty to
the Sovereign characterized utterances
of Reformers;

Outbreak of December 1937 was not so much a rebellion as what Goldwin Smith has called "A spurt of civil war" -

Prior to that time, hositility and struggle were

directed against local dominant group 
Mackenzie and other Reformers genuinely devoted to

British system of government and of

justice - see exhibit

Criticism of Home Government was on basis of its lack
of understanding and indifference to situation
in Canada, and failure to take steps to
correct abuse of existing system;

In issuing call to arms, aim was expressed of forcing the Governor to put Executive Council on responsible basis;

People of Upper Canada were moved by blind sense of rage at injustices, and feeling of impationse to secure change -
