

*Proposed Children's Hospital,
Montreal*

AS certain of the supporters (not medical men) of our City Hospitals believe in the all-sufficiency of these institutions for the treatment of those diseases for which the Children's Hospital is to be especially adapted, six of the most famous physicians and surgeons, who have studied and treated the different forms of tuberculosis on this continent have been communicated with, and asked to express an opinion as to whether pure air and sunlight are especially efficacious in the treatment of these diseases, and whether a hospital built on a high level in the country, surrounded with large verandahs and surmounted by a glass roofed solarium, as has been planned for the Children's Hospital, would prove to be more advantageous for the treatment of such suffering children than the ordinary wards of a city hospital.
