Sec. 4. No brother who is in arrears for three coments are more, shall be entitled to receive any sick benefits from this Lodge by reason of any bagments he may make during his sickness or booky infiguity.

Sec. 5. On the death of a brother entitled to oenefits, there shall be appropriated from the finds of the Lodge the sum of \$75.00 to defray his funeral expenses, and on the death of a brother's wife \$50.00 to defray her funeral expenses according to article 9, section 7 of the Constitution.

Sec. 6. If a brother of this or any other Lodge of K. of P., who is in good standing, is in such circumstances as to require special relief, his case shall be referred to the Relief Committee, which shall consist of the C. C., the V. C., and the M. of E.

Sec. 7. On the first regular convention following the burial of any deceased member, or his wife, the M. of F. is directed to charge to each and every member of the Lodge as dues, a pro rata angunt of the sum paid out for funeral benefits.

Sec. 8. A member while sick or receiving benealts cannot become in arrears for dues, but the amount of his dues shall be deducted from the amount drawn for his benefits.

Sec. b. It shall be the duty of every member on ascertaining that a brother is sick or in distress, to report the same to the C. C., or K. of R. and S. immediately.

Sec. 10. Members of this Lodge reported on the sick list must remain at home after 5 p. m. in the winter and 7 p. m. in the summer, to enable the visiting committee to fulfill their duty properly.
