

Grand organist.....A lyre.

Grand pursuivant.....Arms of the grand lodge with rod
and sword crossed.

The jewels of the grand chaplain, treasurer, secretary, deacons, directors of ceremonies, sword bearer, standard bearer, organist and pursuivant, are to be within a circle, with an embossed wreath composed of a sprig of acacia and an ear of corn.

The jewel of a grand steward of the grand lodge is a cornucopia between the legs of a pair of compasses, extended upon an irradiated gold plate, within a circle, on which is engraved, "Grand Lodge of Antient Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick."

Grand tiler.....The sword in a circle, on which is
engraved, "The Grand Lodge of
New Brunswick : Grand Tyler."

All the above jewels to be of gold or gilt.

Masters of lodges.....The square.

Past masters.....The square and the diagram of
the 47th prob. 1st book of Euclid,
engraved on a silver plate, pen-
dant within it.

Senior warden.....The level.

Junior warden.....The plumb.

Chaplain.....A book on a triangle.

Treasurer.....The key.

Secretary.....The cross pens.

Deacons.....The dove.

Director of ceremonies.....The cross rods.

Organist.....The lyre.

Inner guard.....The cross swords.

Stewards.....The cornucopia.

Tiler.....The sword.

All the above jewels to be of silver.
