BRINKWORTH. A village in Rawdon township, Hastings County, 21 miles north-west of Belleville, the county seat, and 1 mile from Hoard's, on the M div G T Ry, its nearest railway point. Nearest bank at Stirling, 6 miles east. Population, 100. Mail daily. Daniel Hoffman, postmaster.

BRINSLEY. A village in McGillivray township, Middlesex County, 24 miles north-west of London, the county seat, 5 west of Clandeboye, on the L H & B line G W div G T Ry, the nearest railway station, and 5 north of Ailsa Craig, the nearest bank location. It contains Episcopal and Methodist churches, and public school. Stages daily to West McGillivray and Clandeboye, 10c and 20c respectively. Population, 100. Mail daily. George Brown, postmaster.

BRINSTON'S CORNERS. A village in Matilda township, Dundas County, 48 miles west of Cornwall, the county seat, and 8 north of Iroquois, on the G T Ry, its nearest railway point. Nearest bank at Morrisburg. Settled in 1873. It contains a Methodist church, and a public school, and ships grain and produce. Stage daily to Iroquois, fare 50c. Population, 150. Telegraph, GNW. Mail daily. Charles Locke, postmtr.

BRISBANE. A small place on the Credit river, in Erin township, Wellington County, 16 miles north-east of Guelph, the county seat, 2½ south of Erin, a station on the E br C V line O div C P Ry, its nearest railway point, and 12 north-west of Georgetown, the nearest bank location. Settled in 1830. It has a Methodist church and a common school, and ships produce and grain. Stages daily to Ospringe, Everton, Eramosa, Guelph and Erin. Population, 20. Mail daily. Joshua Ashley, postmaster.

BRITANNIA. A country office, in Toronto township, Peel County, 6 miles south-east of Brampton, the county seat and nearest banking point, and 4½ from Cookville, on the C P Ry, its nearest railway point. Settled in 1863. It has a Methodist church and public school, and ships produce. Population, 50. Mail daily. James A Greenius, postmaster and blacksmith.

BRITANNIA STATION. A station on the E div C P Ry, in Carleton County, 6 miles south-west of Ottawa, the county seat, and nearest banking point, nearest post office at Hintonburg. Express, Dominion.
