

THE QUEBEC TRANSCRIPT.

The prospectus has been issued for the publication, in this city, of a new semi-weekly journal, to be called *The Canadian Colonist*. It is to be published by Mr. Jacques, under the editorial direction of Mr. Hunter, formerly of the *Liberator*.

The launch of the steam-ship built by Mr. Mann, which was expected to take place this morning, has been deferred, in consequence of the unfavorable state of the weather.

The Hull, Rigging, &c., of the brig *Caroline*, stranded on Green Island, was sold yesterday by auction to Mr. Oliver for £130.

We have received, and shall publish in our next, a plan proposed by W. Wilson, Esq., (formerly one of the Landing Waiters and Searchers in the Customs at this port) for the removal of the losses and perplexities to which ship-masters and owners are every season subjected, and the serious interruptions which commerce experiences by the thoughtless and irregular conduct of seamen. This plan appears to be every way feasible, and is likely effectually to remedy the evil complained of as they could be devised. It is received with the sanction of the whole of the Clergy, and the unqualified approbation of the Board of Trade, and of many of the most intelligent and influential gentlemen of this city.

The Florida war is going bravely on as usual. The Indians are playing havoc on the Santa Fe, killing the Sovereigns, and carrying off the spoils of War without mercy; a body of them went into Tampa and rescued all their brethren who were prisoners at that post. They won't come in to treat, saying that if General Macomb wants to treat he must go to them. This is about the largest and the strangest war that was ever waged.

To the Editor of the *Quebec Transcript*.—In consequence of some new arrangement it is required that three copies of every entry be presented at the Custom House when paying duty on Goods, instead of two as heretofore. Now I have always been of opinion that the importer is obliged to furnish but one copy, and that giving the duplicate was generally done with a view to expedite business. But when we are told to make every entry in triplicate it is high time we should inquire if it is compulsory or not. If not, let it at least be considered as optional, and an act of courtesy if done. In the United Kingdom, I believe, a single copy is all that is required, and I do not see why—as they are not sent to England—three copies should be required here.
