At this time of unrest and possible danger by sea the two Canadian stockmen, to whom recently a shipment of horses was consigned from the Clyde, are to be congratulated for their firm belief that the demand is as good as ever for really first class horses. Graham Brothers, the well known Ontario Clydesdale men.
