Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of $\pounds 25$, be granted and paid to *Foster Hutchinfon*, Elq; for Drafting Bills, and other fervices performed by him in the last Session of Assembly.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of $f_{.20}$, be granted and paid to the Keeper of the Council Chamber and the House of Assembly, for her Extra Services during the prefent and past Session.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of £.10, be granted and paid to the Messenger of His Majesty's Council, for his Extra Services during the prefent and past Session.

The Chairman also acquainted the House, that he was directed by the Committee to move for leave to fit again, to confider further of a Supply to be granted for the Support of His Majefty's Government.

The faid Report and Refolutions, were read throughout a first and second time, and upon the Question severally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing Refolutions to the Council and defire their Concurrence to the fame.

Then the House adjourned, 'till To morrow, at Ten of the Clock.

On Motion, *Refolved*, That in future the Apartments appropriated for the accommodation of the Houfe of Affembly, shall on no account be made use of during the recess of the House; and that the same shall remain under the care of the Speaker; who is requested to see that this Refolution is observed.

Mr. Dimeck, moved the Houfe as follows: It being underftood that application has been, or is about to be made to His Majefty; for Letters Patent to erect a Corporation for the establishment of a Publick Bank in this Province, referred therefore, that the Agent of the Province be instructed; humbly to intreat his Majefty, not to grant any Letters Patent or Charter of Incorporation, to enable any Perfons to establish a Bank, until it shall have been determined by the Legislature of this Province that such an Establishment shall be beneficial init; because if a public Bank is established; it should be by the Sanction of the Provincial Legislature, and under such Restrictions and Regulations as it shall think proper to make, which being feconded and put; and the House dividing thereon; there appeared for the Motion, Seventeen, against it Ten;
