Ordered, That the said Petition be referred to the Special Committee appointed to examine and report on all Petitions relating to Miscellaneous subjects.

A Petition of Ezra Wickwire, William B. Aitkin, John B. Howlett, and John C. Mackeown, Trustees of the Grammar School in Georgetown, praying that the Salary of the Master of the said School may be increased.
