On motion, the said Bill was read a first time.

A Message from the House of Assembly by Mr. Owen—with the Bill intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act made and passed in the Eleventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act to authorize the Conviction and Punishment, in a Summary way, of Persons committing Common Assaults and Batteries"—passed, as amended by His Majesty's Council :

Also, with a Bill intituled "An Act for appropriating certain Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-two"—to which they pray the concurrence of His Majesty's Council.

On motion, the last mentioned Bill was read a first time.

Ordered, that a further Conference be desired with the House of Assembly on the subject matter of the Amendments proposed by the Council to the Bill intituled "An Act to establish the times and places for holding the Supreme Court in King's and Prince Counties, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

Ordered, that the Honorables *T. H. Haviland* and *The Attorney General* be a Committee to manage the same—to meet in the Committee-Room instant.
