COUNTY AND DISTRICT.

Alex. Smith, Liberal organizer says that the lists now being received are the ones on which the next Dominion election will be held.

The Conservatives of North Guy have nominated Mr. Geo. M. Boyd, as their candidate for the Local Legislature. The convention was addressed by Mr. Gamoy and Mr. Mescampbell.

Within the past few days a large number of one-dollar Dominion of Canada bills have been floating around. One issue A 1898 is a photo wood production, and bears the log rolling scene vignette. Readers of the war news will have noticed one or two references to the fact that tinned meats for the Russian troops are prepared by a process which enables the contents of each tin to be served hot without a fire. This boon is secured by having the ordinary tins filled with food "jacketed" in patent tins. The patent contains water, together with a chemical mixture by means of which the water can be raised to boiling point in ten minutes or a quarter of an hour. All that it is necessary to do when it is desired to heat the food is to puncture the top of the patent tin, the chemical mixture being thereby forced into the water which soon begins to boil.

Farming in Pennsylvania seems to be in the way to drift largely into the hands of women. There are a great many German farmers in the eastern section, and for the last two years the women have been doing much of the farm labour, even to the ploughing. The daughters are found in the field, while the sons are at college, at the loom in the rolling mill or cigar factory or "clerking" in the city. This year, not only the German women, but the farmers' wives and daughters everywhere, went into the fields. It was the only way to save the crops after the long and damaging drouth. Modern agricultural machinery made the task a comparatively easy one, since much of it can be operated as well by the farmers' daughters as by the sons, who have forsaken the farm.

Judge Verson, of Toronto, has decided that the who borrows money to pay a gambling debt contracts a perfectly legal obligation as between himself and the man from whom he borrows and can be sued for it, whether the lender knows or does not know that the money was wanted to pay a gambling debt. But the man who wins money at cards cannot sue the man who lost to him if he does not pay. The suit in which this decision was given arose out of a poker game. F. L. Leduc, a commercial traveller from Montreal, took a hand in a small game, in which six others took part. Luck did not come his way, and at the end of the game he was \$125 out. Thereupon he drew a check for the amount and one of the winners, Jas. Smith cashed it for him. When Smith presented this check for payment there were no funds. Then he saw Leduc, who asked him to accept notes in lieu of check. Smith did so but as they were not met he sued Leduc. Judgment was given against Leduc with costs.

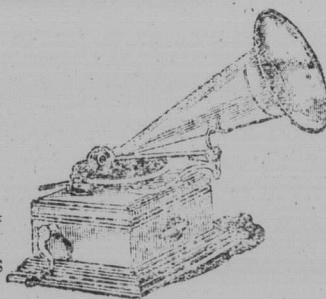
