Is it Scott's of the Ardnamoan Case?
London, Dec. 30.—The body of a man who had committed suicide was found today in a lodging house in Old Ford Road, East London. The man had shot himself with a revolver in the temple. When the police saw the body today they were at once struck by its resemblance to the descriptions of the mysterious "Scott," for whom they have been looking for months in connection with the alleged murder of Lieut. Hambrough. "Scott" was jointly indicted with Alfred John Monson for the killing of Lieut. Hambrough, and when the case came on for trial at Edinburgh a few days ago and "Scott" did not appear for trial, he was declared an outlaw. Monson was tried and acquitted by the jury returning a verdict of "not proven," but the police continued their search for "Scott." The man found dead is supposed to have shot himself last evening. The police have sent for some of "Scott's" body, as they think it is undoubtedly his.
