FOR STENOGRAPHERS.

Inquiry by the reporter at business houses and at the Business College confirms the impression that the demand for good stenographers and typewriters is increasing, and exceeds the supply. This notwithstanding that a greater number of young men and women are taking instruction in these branches than ever before. Applications for stenographers and young men with business training come to Mr. Osborne from all parts of the province, and even from outside the province. Not long since a Prince Edward Island business house applied to the Fredericton Business College for a male stenographer, but was informed that none were to be had here, as all who were studying, or were likely to enter the College in the near future, had positions awaiting them. The P. E. I. firm was referred to the Halifax college, and was informed that similar conditions prevailed there. Of course, in this as in all other professions it is good help that is invented—not mediocre.

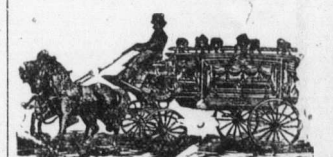
