

Britain to Have Invisible Airship.

Telegram London, Sept. 27.-Patents have een granted in England for an improved airship which at a distance of one thousand yards will be invisible. Fashion Plates. Its envelope will be made of chromum, a metal possessing such a highly olished surface that it will be equiv-

alent to a mirror. As metal will always reflect the color of its environment, either bright or murky, according to the atmosphere, this airship will be inlistinguishable.

To prevent the lower part of the airship from showing the reflection the earth, which would make the ressel stand out prominently in the sky, there will be a special keel runing the length of the craft.
