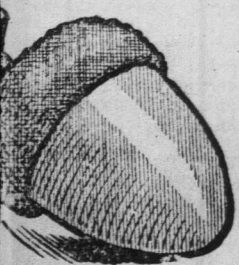

## War News.

Messages Received  
Previous to 9 A.M.

### IN GERMAN EAST AFRICA.

LONDON, Aug. 17.  
The ring around the forces defend-  
ing German East Africa is being  
drawn closer. An official statement  
received to-day from General Smuts  
reports that the British have cleared  
a difficult hilly country and captured  
several important positions being  
separated from the central railway by  
25 miles of open country.

### ARTILLERY ACTIVE ON SOMME FRONT.

PARIS, Aug. 17.  
The French official statement this  
evening says: On the Somme front  
our artillery was active to-day and  
carried out numerous destructive  
bombardments against enemy organ-  
izations. There has been no infantry  
action. The number of unwounded  
prisoners taken north of the Somme  
yesterday exceeds 200. We also cap-  
tured five machine guns. There has  
been the usual cannonading on the  
remainder of the front.

### GERMAN ATTACKS REPULSED.

LONDON, Aug. 17.  
Six determined German attacks on  
the British trenches northwest of  
Pozières were repulsed with heavy  
losses to the attackers, according to  
an official statement issued by the  
War Office to-night. To the north-  
west of Bazentin the British captured  
about 100 yards of German trenches.  
The text of the statement follows:  
On our right there was considerable  
artillery activity all day. Last night  
and early this morning the enemy de-  
livered a series of determined coun-  
ter attacks on our trenches to the  
northwest of Pozières on a broad  
front with considerable forces. Six  
times the infantry advanced to the  
attack, but ran back suffering very  
heavy losses. Our guns and machine  
guns did great execution. In no case  
did he succeed in entering our line.  
Northwest of Bazentin we captured  
about 100 yards of trenches. A coun-  
ter attack made by the enemy to-day  
from Martinguing was repulsed, some  
prisoners being captured by us. A  
German aeroplane was brought down  
behind our lines near Pozières.

### LYDIA GEORGE ADDRESSES WELSH SINGERS.

ABERYSTWETH, Wales, Aug. 17.  
"Britain's honor is not dead, her  
might is unbroken, her destiny unful-  
filled, her ideals unshattered by her  
enemies," declared the Secretary for  
War, Mr. Lloyd George, addressing  
the Welsh Singing Societies at Elis-  
tedford to-day. "Britain is more  
alive, more potent, she has greater  
dominions, her influence is wider, her  
purpose deeper, more exalted than  
ever. Why shouldn't her children  
sing?"

### ANOTHER AIR RAID.

ROME, Aug. 17.  
Another Austrian air raid on Ven-  
ice is reported in an official an-  
nouncement issued by the War Office  
to-night. Only slight damage was  
done and there were no casualties.

### WEAKNESS OR DISORDER.

PARIS, Aug. 17.  
The operations on the Somme yester-  
day were merely the detail of an  
offensive, and only of local bearing,  
a high military officer explained to-  
day to the Associated Press. But sig-  
nificance is derived from the fact that  
the Germans did not counter attack  
as usual. Never before have they  
failed to react when successfully at-  
tacked. Their failure to do so in this  
case is either a sign of weakness, or  
more likely because of confusion and  
disorder.

### SITUATION UNCHANGED.

PETROGRAD, Aug. 17.  
An official this evening says: The  
situation on the Western and Caucas-  
us fronts is unchanged.

### ADJOURNMENT OF PARLIAMENT.

NEW YORK, Aug. 17.  
A News Agency despatch from Lon-  
don, published to-day says: Premier  
Asquith announced to-day that Par-  
liament would adjourn Tuesday or  
Wednesday next until October 10.  
This step is taken to avoid an appeal  
to the country. There is a general  
feeling of disappointment with the  
Coalition Government. Recent out-  
spoken attacks on it by Redmond,  
Dillon and Devlin have laid bare its  
inefficiency to deal with the great  
questions growing out of the war, and  
its breakdown in attempting to han-  
dle the Irish Home Rule Bill.

### TROUBLE IN CHINA.

PEKING, Aug. 17.  
Chinese officials assert that the  
clash on Aug. 13th at Cheng Chai-trin

between Japanese and Chinese sol-  
diers was caused by the resistance of  
Japanese armed peaders whom the  
Chinese endeavored to expel from  
Mongolia and prevent them from sell-  
ing weapons to Mongolian outlaws.  
The right of Japanese troops to enter  
Mongolia is denied by the officials.
