(Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency)—A despatch from Sydney, N.S.W., says that in connection with Capt. Carmichael's suggestion for closer cooperation between South Africa and Australia, especially with a view to stimulating recruiting, Acting Premier Watt cabled to South Africa stating that if Premier Botha agrees, the Commonwealth is willing to open negotiations with a view to exchanging Australian and South African public speakers with the object of assisting recruiting. Acting Premier Watt also cabled to Lloyd George, asking him to send a sealed message relating to the fourth anniversary of the war, in order to enable the widespread simultaneous delivery of the message
