Construction of Large Motor Vessel in Glasgow.

The British twin-screw Diesel en-

gined vessel "Glenapp," which has just been built by a Glasgow shipyard is, according to the local press, the largest and most powerful motor vessel in the world. It is of 10,000 tons deadweight, and has two sets of engines, constructed by Messrs. Harland & Wolff, at their Glasgow works. These give a total of 6,600, which figures represent a very marked progress in this type of vessel. The engine room auxiliaries, also all deck machinery, including the steering gear, are electrically driven, the power being generated by two auxiliary Diesel sets in the engine room. A small oil-fuel boiler supplies steam for heating and cooking systems and for fire-extinguishing purposes. The oil fuel is carried in double bottoms. The vessel is designed with four masts, three of which act as derrick posts, and the accommodation for officers and crew is on the most up-todate lines, separate messrooms being supplied for seamen and motormen, aid separate living rooms for
