



The President of the Swiss Republic in Its Six Hundrodth Year.



The chief official personage of Switzer-had is Dr. Weiti, of Glarus, President of the "Bundesrath" or Federal Council of the swiss Republic. It must be very in-teresting for Canadians to know something of the methods of the Executive of a Gov-ernment that has been a republic since 1291. The Swiss President's authority does not resemble that of a President of the United States or a President of the French Republic. The Swiss President is a comparatively unimportant officer, yet the Swiss claim that theirs is a freer Govern-ment than that of the United States. The Swiss claim that the Bundesrath collect-iey, which consists of aeven members ap-pointed for three years by the General Assembly.
