#### POLITICAL POINTS.

Lincoln Patrons Disclaim Any P. P. A. Affiliation.

Lambton Patrons Reorganize But Defer Nominating a Candidate.

LAMBTON PATRONS. PETROLEA, Feb. 13 .- The annual meeting of the Patrons of Industry for the county of Lambton met in the council chamber today. The attendance of delegates was very limited. The chair was occupied by John Munro, Rutherford, vice-president, the association having suffered by the death of Joseph Beatie, president of the Lambton Association. The auditors' report showed a balance of \$2,185. Officers appointed for the present year are: President, J. Munro; Rutherford; vice-president, Wm. Jordan, Rutherford; secretary-treasurer, D. S. Robertson, Wyoming; sentinel, John Marden, Oakdale; auditors, J. L. Wilson and John Dupee; county trustees, Joseph Osborne, John Hunter and D. Brownlee, all of Wyoming; delegate to Grand Association, J. C. Wood, Florence, alternate delegate, John Munro. The advisability of bringing out Patron candidates for both Houses of Parliament was discussed at some length, but it was decided to take no action at present.

PATRONS AND THE P. P. A. The St. Catharines Journal says: "At the recent meeting of the County Association of Patrons of Industry a resolution was passed disavowing any connection with or indorsation of the P. P. A. candidate, Major Hiscott. The resolution, which was moved by Mr. S. J. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Edward Webb, sets forth that the Patrons of Industry recognize all Christian religious and people as equal, and disavows emphatically, on the part of the delegates assembled, any knowledge or intention of officially supporting the P. P. A. nominee."

POLITICAL NOTES. The Patrons of Industry convention is to be held at Aylmer to-day (Wednesday) to nominate a cardidate for the Dominion for

the east riding of Elgin. The Patrons of Industry were to convene at Napanee Tuesday, but on account of the storm and bad roads the meeting was poorly attended and was adjourned till Feb. 20.

#### THE CATTLE TRADE.

No Fneumonia in Canada-A Report Sent to the Home Government.

OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 13.-Hon. A. R. Angiers states that a very long and interesting report on the Canadian export cattle trade had been forwarded to the Imperial Government. Until such time as it reached the Colonial Office it would not be made public, out of deference to the British authorities.

It is understood that the report goes to establish beyond contradiction that there is not now, nor has there been at any time, since the whole controversy started betwen the two Governments, any pleuropneumonia in Canada. This is shown by the reports of the Government's veterinary inspectors and others appointed to investigate the matter. Every point raised by the British Board of Agriculture has been answered satisfactorily. There is therefore a strong hope in official circles that the report will be the means of removing the embargo imposed against Canadian cattle by the British Government.

MONTREAL, Feb. 13 .- The Star's special cables from London savs: "The Right Hon. Herbert Gardner, president of the Board of Agriculture, in writing to the Dundee cattle traders, says that he is most anxious to reopen British ports to Canadian cattle. Communications on the various points disputed have been made through the Colonial Office to the Canadian Government, and as soon as an answer is received the subject will again receive the most careful consideration by the Board of Agriculture.
