A NOVEL YACHT **QUIET AT ST. PETERSBURG**

Small Craft Without Fannel, Sails, Easter Ushered In Without the Expected Disturbances.

London, April 23. — A 45-foot cruising yacht without a funnel, without sails, and without oars, has left the harbor of London to reach the coast of St. Petersburg, April 30, 3:30 a.m., with Easter Day.—Russia's greatest festival of joy and peace was ushered in with none of the disorder and rioting that have been the accompaniment of the revolution.
