

The dead are:

Mrs. Baker was alive when taken out of the wreck, but expired after reaching Buffalo. Thelma Baker, daughter of Mrs. Edith Baker, is now in hospital in a critical condi-

Daniel Fretz was formerly a farmer of Bertie Township, but recent-ty had been living in Colorado. The Fretz family were here for a holiday, having made the trip in the car in which they met their death. The party of eight had just left the residence of Deputy Reeve Baker, near the Stevensville station, with Mr. Fretz driving, and had turned out of the Baker lane to cross the track when they were struck by the T., H. and B. train, which was traveling about 50 miles an hour. The bodies were badly mangled by the impact,

and the car was torn to pieces. Engineer Humphrey says he did not see the car at all, and also de-clared he sounded his whistle for the ossing. His fireman, however, saw the car approaching the track, but not unitl too late to give the warning to the engineer. Conductor Ferguson was in charge of the train. The injured were put on the same train and taken to Buffalo.

OTTAWA, July 20 .- Quietly and without ostentation, Hon. Dr. Beland, minister of soldiers' civil re-establishment in the King government was married in the Juniorate Chapel of Sacred Heart Church early this morning.

The bride was Miss Henrietta van Laethem, formerly of Belgium, but who has been in Ottawa for the past few years.

The ceremony was performed by Rev. Father Paquette, O.M.I., in the presence of Hon. Jacques Bureau. and Consul-General Goor of Belgium. who acted as witnesses.

No others were present, and pub licity regarding the quiet event was discouraged by the groom, who, with his bride, has left for a brief honey-moon trip to Northern New York. westward, the minister having planned a trip of inspection to the

Pacific Coast.
This is the third venture of Dr. Beland into matrimony. In June of 1895 he married Florie Gerin Lajoie, a French-Canadian maiden of a well-known family. From this marriage there was one daughter, who later married M. Mathieu, a notary of Montreal, and a nephew of Mgr. Mathieu of Regina. The first Mad-

ame Beland died in 1908. In 1914 Dr. Beland was wedded to a Belgian countess, and when the war broke out they were on their honeymoon in the bride's homeland. Both remained and offered their services to the medical staff ofthe Belgian troops, and both declined to seek safety when the forces of the Germans poured down on Antwerp. The minister was taken prisoner

and retained as such for the greater period of the war. Madame Beland later died in Holland without husband and wife ever meeting again. The third Madame Beland, it is stated, was a firm friend of the late She is young and handsome and of the vivacious type.
