Toronto, July 9.—There were still 400 state cattle on the market at the Dominion live stock exchange today. Trade was slow with prospects of a small holiday trade. Prices for all classes were lower than last week. Export shipments during the week totalled 1,900 cattle.

The calf trade was a shade easier with tops at \$10.00. Shipments to Buffalo during the week totalled 1,400.
