which had been prepared in my office, or any other document on the same lines. The consequence of this has been that the city, seeing that on account of the bargain they had made with the Toronto Railway Company, they were absolutely bound in their own interest to own this part of the Lake Shore-road at any cost, had to take it over for its entire length, including the bridge over the Humber. In addition to this they paid the county \$650 in cash, and have subsequently been ordered to pay an award of \$3500 taw costs. The agreement to take over the road upon the terms which I have last mentioned was executed by the city and county would both endeavor to procure legislation to validate and confirm the contract. Last session it came up before the Private Bills Committee, when the Mayor, backed by the City Solicitor, with an utter disregard of what should have been considered good faith between corporations or individuals, did his best to have the agreement thrown out by the committee. 
