It is more than a year fince I received this intelligence. I have made the moft diligent inquiries concerning Mr. Evans, but have received no further information; but hope I foon thall, in anfwer to feveral letters fent to America. Should no certain information be received of, or by, Mr. Evans, I truft that the very ftrong probability of the exiftence of fuch a people, as evinced by the preceding papers, will induce the Miffionary Society, or fome other body of Chriftians in England, or America, to fend a fufficient number of perfons, properly informed and provided, fully to inveftigate a matter fo replete with curiofity and importance.

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
