Stock Notes.

heavy draught farm horse \$150, one King Tom mare \$150, one pure bred Berkshire sow \$20, two ram lambs, long wool \$20, one Shorthorn cow and heifer \$100, one mare, Strader's Royal George, bred to Nosenman, \$100; summing up \$1,250. Mr. Martin has purchased 240 acres of land in East Prim, Meridian, Manitoba. Mr. Martin's herd still numbers about 50 head of pure Shorthorns. They are founded mainly on the Bow Park herds. One family, the Lavinas, are from the herd of Mr. Jas. S. Smith, Maple Lodge, Ont. Some are descended from a cow Princess, imp. by H. Thompson, St. Marys, and some trace to the old Adam Ferguson stock. The first bull was Eastern Prince bred by F. W. Stone, Guelph, and by Grand Duke of Moreton. Much of the younger stock is by Orphus 17th, bred at Bow Park, and carrying Wild Eyes and Oxford blood. The horses number about 35 head. The light road brood mares, of which there are near a dozen, are by such sires as Don Juan, Ohio Bacchus, Imp. Melanly and King Tom. A number of heavier mares are bred to the horse Nosenman, by Nosenman Imp.; dam by England's Glory Imp., one of the stock horses, the other is General Gordon, sired by Mark Twain, and out of the St. Lawrence mare Old Nell.
