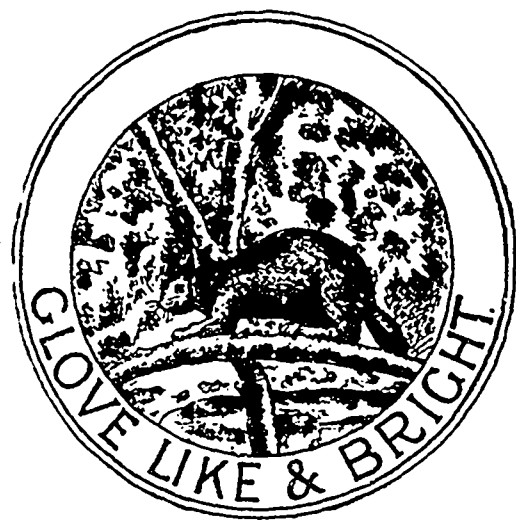
## Caution and Warning
