The editor finds in the letters almost a connected narrative full of literary interest.

## Life of James Russell Lowell.

Begins with ancestry after the biographical fashion, lingers a little over his boyhood and student life, touches lightly the short and unproductive period when he was finding his vocation, and skims along his earlier work till the hero appears with the Biglow Papers. From that time on there is nothing light that concerns the point, professor, editor, litterateur, philosopher, diner, with dip-lomatist, patriot, patriarch; and the charm of the book is in the fact that the life is mainly told by Lowell himself and his friends.
