BRANTFORD MOWER.


Never Fear

THE BAR CONNECTION is illustrated in the adjoining cut. It is substantial and sufficiently rigid to withstand the hardest cutting, and at the same time forms a most flexible joint, admitting of placing the cutter bar in every desirable position and allowing it to follow the most irregular ground surface (PATENTED).


RANGE OF TILT—You can leave any desirable length of stubble with the Brantford Mower, or you can shear off the crop close to the surface. The tilt lever is convenient and very easy to set.

The lever for raising the bar is also easy to handle, and the bar can be quickly raised to pass obstructions with comparatively little effort, being assisted by the large coil spring alongside the pole.
