"ALL CANADIAN" ENTERTAINMENT SERIES Patriotic Plays, Drills, Recitations and Exercises

- B. EDITH LELEAN GROVES**
The Soldiers of the Soil and the Farmerettes: A Dramatic Drill (1918)25
This little Exercise, or Playlet, or Drill, is something entirely new. Time: about twenty minutes. Costumes: overalls, or skirts and middies.
Saluting the Canadian Flag..... .15
Any number of boys or girls up to twenty-five may take part in this great patriotic exercise. No special costuming is required. No fifteen minutes.
- A Patriotic Auction (1918)..... .25**
A jolly little Patriotic Drama for eight characters, five girls and three boys. Time: half an hour. Costumes: simple in the extreme.
Canada Calls (1918)25
This is a Patriotic Play dealing with the present moment. Time: anywhere from twenty minutes to an hour, it all depends upon the number of drills given.
A Spring Fantasy (1918)25
Such a dainty little Drama as this is! It is suitable for Spring or Summer entertainments, indoors or out. Children of all sizes may take part and as many as the stage will accommodate. Time: thirty minutes or longer.
Santa Claus and the Magic Carpet; or a Conspiracy Against Santa Claus: A Christmas Comedy25
A Comedy in which from twenty to forty girls and from four to twelve boys can take part. Costumes: Modern, Santa Claus, Sailor Girls, Sailor Boys, Fairies, etc. Time: sixty to ninety minutes.
Britannia25
From twenty to twenty-four girls or boys may take part in this play. Costumes: National. A very pretty tableau is built up with Britannia as the central figure. Time: twenty minutes.
The Wowing of Miss Canada25
This play is arranged for from fifteen to twenty-five girls and four boys. Costumes: National. Time: one hour.
The War on the Western Front25
Twenty-one girls and one boy take part in this play, although it is quite elastic and twice that number may be used if they are available. It may also be given as a series of recitations, then only nine girls and one boy will be required. Time: forty minutes.
The Key of Jack Canuck's Treasure House. .25
About twenty girls and as many boys may take part in this play, more if there be room. Costumes: Miss Canada, Jack Canuck, Wisdom, Fairies, Indians, Scotsmen, Sailors, Aviators, Boys in Khaki and Boy Scouts. Time: sixty to ninety minutes.
The Making of Canada's Flag25
A play for ten girls and from twenty to twenty-four boys. Costumes: National and Patriotic. Time: sixty to ninety minutes.
A Canadian Fairy Tale25
For about sixteen girls and the same number of boys. Costumes: National for the Irish, Scotch, English, Canadian girls and Indians. The fairies and the Green Men may be fantastically dressed. Time: sixty to ninety minutes.
- Grand March With Flags15**
This is a march for twenty-four girls; they may be dressed in military costume or in simple white dresses with red, white and blue sashes. Time: about fifteen minutes.
Canada, Our Homeland15
A distinctly Canadian exercise. Twelve children, either boys or girls, take part. Time: about ten minutes.
Primary Pieces (1918)25
This is a collection of recitations and dialogues suitable for the very tiny ones.
Fancy Flag Drill, Rule Britannia15
Flag Drill for nine girls. Costumes: National for Britannia, plain white dresses with red, white and blue.
Fancy Flag Drill, We'll Fight for the Grand Old Flag15
Sixteen or twenty-four girls take part in this drill. Time: about twenty minutes.
Holly Drill15
Drill for fourteen girls. Costumes: white dresses trimmed with sprays of holly. An ideal Christmas drill. Time: twelve minutes.
How the Fairies Chose Their Queen..... .15
This is a dainty little Fairy Play for the wee ones. For the principal parts eight little girls and one little boy are required, while the chorus part will take from ten to twenty children, both boys and girls. Costumes for fairies and brownies. Time: about twenty minutes.
Patriotic Scarf Drill15
This is a Drill arranged for twenty-seven girls. Divided into three groups, nine in a group; if the stage be not large enough, two groups of nine may give the Drill. Costumes: simple white dresses. Time: fifteen minutes.

The Festival of the Wheat, or How a Loaf of Bread Grew (1918)25
A very bright play for ten to twenty boys and girls from six to ten years of age. The costumes may be very simple and represent a blacksmith, farmer, miller, reaper, baker, etc. Time: twenty to thirty minutes.
Months: The Dream of the Months: A New Year's Pageant (1918)25
This is a grand play for from twenty-five to sixty-five boys and girls from six to fourteen years of age. It gives a picture of the months and seasons of the year. Time: one hour.

Miss Canada's Reception25
This "smart little play" as an educationist high in Departmental circles put it. Time: one hour and a quarter.
The Girl Guides, by Marjorie Mountain Jarvis25
A play illustrating the workings and laws of the Girl Guides. Time: one to one and a half hours according to the songs or drills introduced. From 12 to any number of girls may take part; costumes: the usual Girl Guide uniforms, etc. (1918.)
The School Fair, by Allegra Cronk (1918)..... .25
A play illustrating a children's School Fair with boys representing different vegetables and girls as Spirits of the Rain, South Wind, etc. Time: one hour or upwards according to the length of the drills used. Costumes: boys in ordinary clothes with baskets of vegetables bearing large prize tickets; girls in white dresses, 8 boys and 8 girls take part. A very bright and amusing play.
