Mr. Maybee was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, on August 29, 1918, and studied at Toronto and Princeton Universities. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy in 1943, and served in the North Atlantic. In 1946, Mr. Maybee was discharged from the Navy and joined the Department of External Affairs. He has served in Nanking, Canberra and Washington. Since August 1961, Mr. Maybee has been head of the Personnel Division of the Department of External Affairs.

Mr. Maybee is married and has five children.

Mr. Williams was born in Nipigon, Ontario, on January 31, 1918, studied at the University of Toronto and joined the Canadian Army in 1942, serving in the U.K. and Northwestern Europe. He joined the Department of External Affairs in 1946, served on the Canadian Delegation to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission in New York and with the Canadian Permanent Delegation to the United Nations in Geneva until 1953. He then served in New Delhi and, from February 1956, on the International Commission for Supervision and Control in Vietnam.

Mr. Williams returned to Ottawa for duty in the Department in 1957 and in 1959 was appointed High Commissioner to Ghana and concurrently Ambassador to the Republics of Togo, Upper Volta and Guinea. He was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Turkey in October 1962.
