While off-farm work has always been a source of cash income to farmers it has become an increasingly more important factor. The table below shows the overall change in this regard for farm operators reporting off-farm work over the 1961-1981 period.

While the number of farms decreased by about 34% over the 20 year period, the number of operators reporting off-farm work decreased by about 20%. In 1961 some 32% reported off-farm work and by 1981 the proportion had increased to almost 39%.

Looking more closely at the composition of the 1981 census data, we have carried out some preliminary analysis concerning time worked off-farm and the differences between age groups.
