By the Honourable Mr. Ferguson:—

November 26—That he will call the attention of the House to the report of A. P. Low, B.Sc., F.R.G.S., at present Director of the Geological Survey, on the Dominion Government expedition to Hudson bay and the Arctic islands on board the Dominion steamer *Neptune* in 1903-04, especially to the valuable information therein contained, showing the feasibility of the navigation of Hudson bay and straits; and will inquire if it is the intention of the Government to promote railway construction from the wheat fields of the Northwest to Fort Churchill, and provide necessary aid to the navigation of the northern internal waters of Canada?
