and the general survey, since this might lead to criticism in certain quarters. I need hardly assure you, however, that both Sir Henry Miers and I will be delighted to give every assistance to the surveyor that we can.

It is possible that the Council at their meeting on July 6th may first either Dr.Cyril Fox, or Dr.E. E.Lowe. Dr.Cyril Fox, as you are doubtless aware, is the Director of the National Museum of Wales. He was Superintendent of the Cambridge Field Laboratories 1912-24, has been a fellow of Magdalene College, a member of several Royal Commissions, and a member of out Council. Dr.E.E.Lowe is the Director of the City Museum, Art Gallery and Libraries, Leicester. He was Secretary of this Association from 1908-18, and its President in 1922. He was specially selected by the Carnegie Trustees in 1928 to visit and report upon American museum work. He is also a member of several Committees dealing with educational work.

Our President, Sir Henry Miers, wishes me to say that he will be in Montreal about July 27th, and that he would much like the opportunity of meeting you and discussing the details of the Montreal Survey. I shall be accompanying him, and I need hardly add that
