Sec. 4.—If during the interim between the meeting of Conference, a call be made by an unsupplied pastor or mission for the services of a candidate for ordination, the case shall be made known to the President, who shall call a meeting of the clergy, at such time and place as the circumstances may require; these shall examine the candidate and if he be found qualified for the ministry, shall ordain him to said office in accordance with Section 3 of this Article.
