

Robertson ; the Regiment posted with the Cavalry was that raised in South Carolina, so that on this bloody day the number of European troops engaged was small, as most of the British troops had been raised in America. As nearly one half of Lord Rawdon's force was posted in reserve, the front, with which he advanced was comparatively small ; that of the Americans presented their whole force, the 2nd Virginia Regiment, under General Hagar, on the right of the road, and the two Maryland Regiments, under Colonel Williams, on the left. The 1st Virginia Regiment, under Lieut.-Colonel Campbell, was on the right of the whole ; the 2nd Maryland, under Lieut.-Col. Ford on the left ; the 2nd Virginia, under Lieut.-Colonel House, and the 1st Maryland, under Colonel Gumby, formed the centre. Greene, conjecturing that the enemy was unapprised of the arrival of his Artillery, had closed the two centre Regiments upon the road, so that they were completely masked ; when these two Regiments suddenly retired to the right and left, and the Artillery began to vomit showers of grape upon the enemy, the confusion and dismay were so conspicuous, that
