A company of Stockbridge Indians was this year employed in his Majefty's fervice, commanded by Indian officers, properly commiffioned by General Shirley, before he was fuperfeded in his command. General Abercrombie was fomewhat at a lofs how to difpofe of this company, and applied to Sir William Johnfon, who advifed, that a part \*, viz. thirty privates and a Lieutenant, fhould fcout and fcour the woods under my direction, which party had arrived while I was out upon my laft fcout, and Lieutenant Stark had ftrengthened their party with fome of our people, and fent them out with particular directions what route to take, the day before I arrived.

About this time his Excellency the Earl of Loudoun arrived at Albany, and had taken upon him the command of the army, to whom Iapplied as I had done before to Gen. Abercrombie, transmitting to him an account of the Indian scout above-mentioned (who returned the 13th with two French scalps, agreeable to their barbarous custom) and defiring that with them I might attempt to penetrate into Canada, and
