TRANSPORT MEN QUIT THEIR JOBS

Omnibus Employees of the Tilling Co., London, Go Out on Strike.

LONDON, Sept. 19.—(Can. Press.)—Not a single omnibus or conductor employed by the Tilling Omnibus Co., whose action in refusing to recognize the men's union is likely to bring about a general strike of transport workers in London, went to work this morning and many of the motor bus lines running from the south to the north of London, which are chiefly supplied by the Tilling Company, were entirely suspended, causing great inconvenience.

Newspapers With Strikers. Several conferences were held in the course of the morning between the omnibus men and the representatives of the employees of the Amalgamated Tube System, at which the action of the latter, in case a general strike should materialize, was discussed. Practically the entire press of London supports the men in their demands, and many of the newspapers declare that the point in regard to the wearing by the men of the badges of their trades unions should never have been raised, and that the Tilling Company has made another blunder.

KING STREET FIRE WAS HARD TO FIGHT

Two Thousand Dollars Damage Caused When Old Building Was Destroyed.

Damage to the extent of \$2200 was done when fire broke out in the building at 74 West King street yesterday afternoon. The call was rung in at 2:30, and although the department responded in fast time the men experienced considerable difficulty in preventing the blaze from spreading to other buildings. As the fire was in the rear of the building some time was lost before the men could reach a position from which they could fight the flames to advantage. The building is a four-story warehouse, owned by G. O'Brien, the second floor of which is occupied by the firm of Levy & Co., dealers in drug supplies. The other floors were unoccupied. The damage to the building is estimated at \$1200, and to the goods \$1000.

HIT WITH AXE HANDLE.

TO INVESTIGATE BIG TIM'S DEATH

Persistent Rumors Afloat That He Was Struck Down by Footpads.

NEW YORK, Sept. 19.—(Can. Press.)—An investigation into "certain features" of the death of Congressman Timothy D. Sullivan, whose mangled body was recently found at a railroad crossing in the Bronx borough, has been begun by District Attorney Whitman. Mr. Whitman would go no further than to say nothing definite had developed as yet. Since the funeral of "Big Tim" rumors have been persistent that he had not met death accidentally, some versions being that he had been set upon by footpads and left unconscious on the tracks or murdered outright.

TORONTO HYDRO HAS A SURPLUS

Profit for First Half of Year Over Seventy Thousand.

COMMERCIAL BUSINESS

Income Derived From That Source Was Gratifying to Commission.

Toronto Hydro system has a profit of \$71,000 for the first half of this year. Chairman Ellis so reported to the commission yesterday. The balance sheet at July 1 shows the assets are \$34,124 more than liabilities.

The chairman submitted the interim accounts of the system for the half year ended June 30, which were adopted by the board.

"That while the income derived from commercial light and power during 1912 fell short of that derived from municipal light and power by nearly \$100,000, the income derived from commercial light and power during the first half of the current year exceeded the amount derived from municipal light and power during the same period by nearly \$70,000."

"That the total income for the quarter ended June last, the smallest quarter in the year, fell short of the income for the March quarter, the second largest quarter in the year, by the amount of less than \$4000, thereby showing a very gratifying increase of business, having regard to the lengthened daylight and the consequent lessened consumption of light pertaining to this quarter."

"That the net surplus for the June quarter, after providing for interest, depreciation and sinking fund, amounted to nearly \$28,500, as against a net surplus for the March quarter of a little over \$48,000, the difference being accounted for by the small falling off in business above mentioned for the June quarter incident to that period of the year and by an increase of a little over two and one-half per cent in the expenses of operation and management, caused principally by extra expense imposed upon the system under the reorganization attendant upon the dismissal of the former acting manager and by the additional expense imposed upon the system by the strike of certain employees immediately thereafter."

"That the net surplus earnings at June 30, after providing fully for the sinking fund instalments accruing thru the purely construction period, amounted to \$34,124.05."

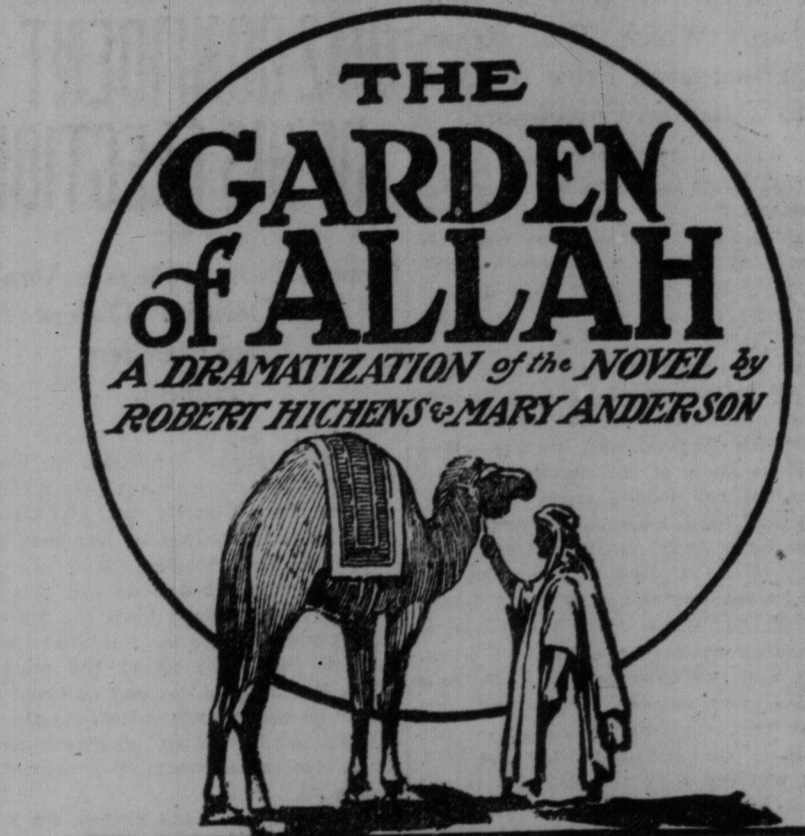
