Tax on liberal
professions.

30. Every person in the said city practicing the profession of an advocate, physician, land surveyor, notary or any other liberal profession within the limits of the said corporation, shall be assessed at the sum of not less than three dollars annually; every person in the said city, receiving an annual salary of \$500 and upwards, however payable, shall pay an annual tax of one per centum upon the annual amount thereof; and the said city council may name a person or persons, to make the roll of the persons and moveable property, mentioned in the different parts of the foregoing sections.

31. The said council shall also have power to make by-laws;

For determining and regulating the duties of the clerks of the market in the said city, and all other persons they may deem proper to employ to superintend the said markets, and for letting the stalls or places for selling upon and about the said market places, and for fixing and determining the duties to be paid by any person selling on any of the said markets any provisions or produce whatever, and for regulating the conduct of all such persons in selling their goods and all produce whatever offered for sale on the said markets;
