good proof before the court of justice in which he fued, and likewife to declare, upon oath, that he had done duty in his parish church, that is, fome part of the duty, for forty Sundays in the year in which he claims his tithes to have become due; or, if he has done duty feldomer than forty times, then to fwear and bring good proof that he has done duty that leffer number of And, if he has done duty for forty times. Sundays, he shall recover his whole tithe : and, if he has done duty on a Sunday feldomer than forty times, he shall recover only fo many fortieth parts of his tithes as there are Sundays on which he has done duty.

This, I imagine, would be a very ufeful regulation. For it has been observed of late years, that many Clergymen, who have but one living, decline their residence upon it, and keep a curate to do the duty of it, while they, themselves, go and reside at fome great town where there is a good deal of company and amusement. This evil
