SUPERIOR GOLD AND COPPER.
A Colorado Mining Superintendent Speaks Very Highly of the Copper Locations.
Mr. James C. Stephenson, a well-known mining superintendent from Colorado, who has been looking over the native copper locations on the east shore of Black Bay, Lake Superior, with a view to making a report on them, reached the city last night. Mr. Stephenson is very well satisfied with the discoveries made there this summer, and predicts a great future for that section. He says that if they had as good a showing in native copper in Montana or Colorado, there would be 5000 people there instead of a week. Mr. Stephenson speaks very highly of the Superior claim, owned by the Superior Copper Company. He says this claim runs along the shore line on the east shore of Black Bay, a high escarpment runs parallel with the lake, and rises to a height of about 120 feet. Between 30 and 70 feet of the strata from the lake level up consists of a conglomerate deposit, which occurs in the amygdaloid formation. This conglomerate is similar in appearance to that of the Calumet and Hecia. It has been the dream of every mine explorer who has been looking for native copper to find a conglomerate deposit like that of the Calumet and Hecia, with native copper deposited in grains and shots all through it. So far the Calumet has been alone in this respect. All the other native copper mines on the south shore have been located on veins, small narrow veins, that occur in the amygdaloid. These veins are exceedingly rich in places, so rich that they are very hard to mine, but the Calumet discovered a bed of conglomerate with copper in grain form all through the rock, and from this deposit it has paid over \$500,000 dividends. The Calumet rock varies from 2 per cent. to 4 per cent. in appearance and richness. The native copper appears in small grains. The outside of the rock is weathered and copper-stained, and every place where it is broken into along this deposit native copper can be found. As a portion of this deposit is about the level of the surrounding country, it can be virtually quarried for a great many years or mined in a manner similar to a coal mine. There will be no hoisting charges for a long time to come. The runs from 2 1/2 to 4 per cent., and the deposit appears to cover the whole of the location. All the ground around this deposit has been taken up, and an American syndicate has already secured an option on the greater part of it for a big sum of money. The situation is very favorable for mining, and a gang of men in a very short time could take out enough rock to keep a couple of steam stamps running. At the Calumet the rock is run into the crusher, stamped fine and the native copper caught on screens. This native copper is then run into bars, and sold for about 1c to 1 1/2c a lb. more than any other copper, owing to its purity. A Boston company last year spent \$100,000 exploring for a similar deposit in the Township of Blake, south of Port Arthur, where considerable that was found, but so far the rock has not been found in place. There is deep water up to this location, and everything is favorable to mining, and it would not take very much to put the property on a paying basis. He says that he understands it is the intention to rush work on the property this winter, and thinks that Black Bay Peninsula will be in a few years producing as much copper as Keweenaw Peninsula, on the south shore. Mr. Stephenson brought with him a few samples of the ore down with him, in which the native copper could be seen in grains disseminated all through the rock.
