





There will be no more certainty of our water under the proposed system than there is to-day, when the sewage is dumped into the bay.

BROOM WINS OUT. An Interesting Case, in Which the

Possession of a Toronto June-

tion Store is Involved.

Toronto Junction, Feb. 11.-A suit been concluded, in the decision given in been concluded, in the decision given meaning the farmers' Loan Company v. James Broom. Mr. Broom has been in possession of a store on Dundas-street, owned by the Farmers' Loan Company, since June, 1839. He has paid no rent and has paid no purchase money. He is still living there and will-continue to do so for many weeks, probably months to come, at the same free rental. The liquidators of the Farmers' Loan Company have been trying to get him out since last November, but they have failed, and failed completely. What is more astonishing is the fact that Mr. Broom is not a lawyer, and yee by astuteness and clever arguing of his own cases before the bar he has nonplussed one of the greatest legal firms in the city of Toronto, comes out of litigation extending over three months without any costs and still holds the property. In 1899, the Farmers' Loan Company gave Mr. Broom possession of the store on the strength of an offer of purchase. Nine months afterwards they refused to accept his offer. It was agreed that if the company did not accept Mr. Broom's offer, that they would lease the place to him at so much per month, he being allowed the cost of any r-pairs or improvements made in the meantime, as advance payement on the lease. The company went into liquidation, and the liquidators tried to get possession on Jan. 22 before Master Winchester. After many adjournments and arguments, decision was given in favor of the Farmers' Loan Company, and an order was given for immediate possession of the property Mr. Broom
