ORATORY TAP WILL BE TWISTED HARD, IT IS ANTICIPATED

City Fathers to Turn It On Tonight.

COUNCIL IS MEETING

Various Questions, Sure to Provoke Speeches, Coming Up.

Although the city council will not be overburdened with work at its session tonight, it is expected that here will be some oratory of the twisted kind.

The Victoria Hospital bazaar will be on the boards of the city council tonight. The council is expected to make the speech of his career on the subject of what shall be the destinies of the hospital, the council or the hospital.

LEAKY BOILERS GIVE CHURCH PEOPLE SCARE

Caused Cancellation of All Centennial Meetings for Week.

Considerable excitement was caused in Centennial Church last night when the boiler sprang a leak, giving the impression that it had been badly cracked. All church meetings were cancelled for the week, as it was supposed that the repairs would take some time to make.

An examination this morning showed that the safety plug had merely been turned out, and in consequence all meetings scheduled for the week, with the exception of the Epworth League tonight, will be held.

WEEK-END TOLL OF LONDONERS WAS HEAVY ONE

Ominous Casualty Reports Continue to Arrive in Large Numbers.

PRIESTS AMONG WOUNDED

Catholic Chaplains From This District Reported Wounded and Gassed.

Week-end casualty reports show another heavy addition to London's honor roll. The heavy gait struck more than a fortnight ago, so far as social men serving in the western war theatre are concerned, has been maintained with a regularity that has been ominous.

Mrs. Joseph Wallace of 534 Dundas street received word by cable on Saturday evening that her brother, Pte. Charles McGee, died of wounds in Belgium on November 17. The message came from Mrs. Wallace's son, Pte. Robert Wallace of the A. M. C., and read as follows:

Charles, here, wounded, Belgium, writing.

Pte. Wallace and his uncle were in a shower bath a little while ago, and who should walk in but Uncle Charles. I was surely surprised and pleased to see him. He looks fine, in fact, better than I ever saw him look before.

He couldn't stay long, but waited until I had finished my bath, and then I walked a long way with him towards his battalion. I hope to see him again soon.

He is married, and is survived by the following brothers and sisters: William in Detroit, Frank in the States, Mrs. Joseph Wallace, 534 Dundas street, Mrs. George C. Chantler, 3041 St. Louis, Mrs. Richard Schreiber, of Blackfriars street.

Two priests among the wounded have been listed among recent casualties according to a message received by the Right Rev. M. F. Fallon, bishop of London, who stated that the Rev. Father McCarthy has been slightly gassed, and Capt. (Rev.) Father Low has been wounded.

The cablegram, which was sent by Lieut.-Col. (Rev.) Father Workman, this information reached his wife, Mrs. McCarthy, 138 Horton street, Saturday. A letter received today announced his death.

This is the second time that the parents of Mr. McCarthy, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur McCarthy, of Mount Brydges, have been affected by the awfulness of war. As Mr. McCarthy was formerly another son, was killed in action about a year ago.

Rev. Father McCarthy was assistant pastor at Mount Carmel and Rev. Father Low, assistant at St. Joseph's Church, Stratford, before proceeding to the front. Father McCarthy left here as a captain, and has since received promotion to his present rank.

Fourth of Family Wounded. Pte. Allan Thodas, 26243, who went overseas with the 15th Battalion, was in a telegram from his wife, Mrs. Allan Thodas, of Windsor avenue east, Springfield Park, reported wounded by shrapnel in action. He is the fourth member of the family to have appeared in the casualty list, two brothers-in-law, Cyril Clement and Stanley Clement, having been wounded and gassed respectively. H. A. Magee, another brother-in-law, the Clemons brothers, has been wounded. A third brother-in-law, Second Lieut. A. C. Drake, is serving with the Imperial forces in Egypt, while the fourth brother, Leslie, is with the Canadian troops overseas.

Capt. Dunlevy's Son Gassed. Gunner Pearson, Dunlevy, who left London with a draft of the 6th Battery, is today reported as seriously gassed. He is now in a hospital at Etaples, France.

Gunner Dunlevy is a son of Capt. "Barney" Dunlevy, who went overseas with No. 1 Depot Unit of Supply, Canadian Army Service Corps, with the first Canadian division.

Another Londoner Killed. Pte. Thomas Murray, a London boy who enlisted with No. 1 A. M. C. training depot here, and later transferred to England to an infantry battalion, has been killed in action. He was the official messenger to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Murray, who now live on Stirling street, but who formerly resided at 622 Piccadilly street, and announced that he was killed on November 3 or 4.

Pte. Murray went overseas with an A. M. C. draft last March. Another of London's Own. Mrs. May Goodman, 185 Maitland street, was officially notified that her husband, Pte. Fred Goodman, 82328, was admitted to No. 6 Field Ambulance Depot, Northampton, with a gunshot wound in the head. Pte. Goodman went overseas with the 142nd Battalion.

Ex-School Teacher. Lieut. H. B. Galpin, a London school teacher, who went overseas with an artillery unit, has been killed in action. He was slightly wounded. He has since returned to duty.

The official casualty lists received at noon today record three more London men listed as wounded. They are: Pte. W. Merriman, W. N. McMillan, whose address is given as "General Postoffice, London," and Arthur Gurnett, 304 Queen's avenue.

Wounded in Thigh. Another Londoner suffered wounds in the recent fighting in Belgium, according to information which reached London today, stating that Pte. Benjamin P. Ward had received a gunshot wound in the right thigh on November 9.

The official word came to his mother, Mrs. P. Ward, 9 Alfred street, Waud, last night with a London Western Ontario unit when wounded.

Pte. George Stephen Laskey, who enlisted here with the 142nd Battalion, is reported wounded in the left arm and admitted to hospital. He is a son of W. J. Laskey, messenger of the Bank of Montreal, an inveterate hard worker, having been twice in hospital since he went overseas. Diphtheria and trench fever were the causes.

Pte. Laskey's wife, who with their two children, resides at 129 Price street, was officially notified today.
