Befides, if Admiral de Fantes's Letter be genuine, of his Meeting in his Boat a Boston Vessel trading beyond the Wess of Hudson's Bay, after leaving his Ship in Lake Belle, upon failing from Lima round California, to 54° North Latitude, wherein he names the Master's Name and Pilot's, Shapley and Seymour Gibbons, and we find a Family of the Name of Shapley then lived at Boston; there would be no further Need of Proof to demonstrate there being a navigable Passage from Hudson's-Bay to the Western Ocean of America.
