

# HELP CHICAGO SOX

Once Canned, But Comes Back to Bolster Up Rowland's Outfit.

Chick Gandil, the broad-shouldered first-sacker, is back with the White Sox, where he played in 1910. This was not exactly Chick's first chance in fast company, for he went south with the St. Louis Browns the previous year, but took part in no games of the championship season.

When Gandil joined the White Sox he became one of the team's most proficient hitless wonders. In 77 games he turned out the skinny average of .193. Comiskey sold him to the Montreal club before the season ended.

It was with Montreal that Gandil began to show remarkable batting ability. He batted 24s in 1911 and started the season of 1912 as if he were going to burn up the league. His heavy hitting attracted the attention of Clark Griffith, who gave \$3,500 and three ball players for Chick.

Washington was going badly when Gandil joined the team early in June, and then the club took an itemediate brace. They won 17 games, 16 on the road, before a home run by J. Franklin Baker stopped their streak at Shibe Park.

Gandil had as much to do with Washington's uncommon spurt as any other player on the team As a matter of fact, Clark Griffith said that next to Waiter Johnson, Gandil's bat did more to make the record than anything else.


