LES DARCY SAID TO BE COMING TO AMERICA

Vancouver, Nov. 1.—A cable received
from Sydney, Australia, says that Les
Darcy, Australian champion, is now on
his way to America, having sailed on
last Thursday, according to a published
rumor, on a boat from the Newcastle
coasting station and not the ordinary
point of departure for passengers. The
cable adds that Darcy was due in Mel-
bourne last week to begin training for
another fight with George Chip, but he
has been missing since last week. It is
thought Darcy is coming to this con-
tinent for a fight with George Carpenter
promoted by Tex Rickard and Sam Mc-
Cracken.

There has been a good deal of mys-
tery about Les Darcy's plans. It was said
recently that he intended to join, and
had joined the army. Previous to this,
however, reports from Australia were to
the effect that Darcy was very anxious
to come to the United States and fight,
but was dissatisfied with the terms
that Snowy Baker had offered him and
that he had been negotiating on his own
hook with American promoters. It was
then reported that Baker had managed
by demanding a strict application of the
emigration laws to get an order pass-
ing prohibiting Darcy from leaving the coun-
try.

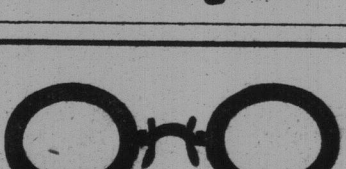
