GRADUATION HITS U. N. B. ATHLETICS

Paul Fraser, Rugby Star, Most Notable Loss—Seely Also Goes

FREDERICTON, May 11.—The class of 1926 of the University of New Brunswick which is to be graduated on Thursday is taking out of the university some of the best athletic material which ever wore the red and black. Four Rugby football players, two hockey players, three basketball players and two track men are included. In several cases the same man figures in more than one sport. Paul W. Fraser, of Saint John, and H. Chipman Seely of Fredericton, formerly of Saint John, are the outstanding athletes of the class, Fraser being a four-sport man and Seely a three-sport man. The Rugby football players are Gordon M. McPhail of Woodstock, T. T. Odell, of St. Andrews; Fraser and Seely. Fraser was the captain, the greatest kicking back field player who ever played with the provincial university and one of the most effective all around backs. Seely stood out by reason of his speed as a wing three-quarter. The others are forwards. The hockey players are Tracy Carter, of Fredericton, captain and goal keeper, and Paul Fraser defence. The basketball players are Paul Fraser, McPhail and Seely all very effective and figuring more than one season on an intercollegiate championship team. The track men are Fraser, a pole vaulter, and Seely a sprinter. It is doubtful if any U. N. B. class has in its men displayed the athletic ability which '26 has.

ANTICOSTI ISLAND IS SOLD OUTRIGHT

Wayagmack Co. Purchases Land From French Senator for \$6,000,000.

QUEBEC, May 11.—It is revealed that the entire Island of Anticosti in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, comprising some 3,000 square miles, has been purchased from Senator Menier of Quebec by the Wayagmack Corp. and Paper Company, instead of only the timber limits as previously reported. A cheque for \$6,000,000 francs or approximately

by \$6,000,000 has been paid over. Senator Menier, it is said, insisted upon a cash transaction as he wished to make a substantial contribution out of it to the "Save the franc" fund of the French government.

The steamer Dampier, consigned to H. E. Kane and Co., shifted from the stream yesterday afternoon to No. 14 berth, Sand Point, to load potatoes for Havana.

FOR YORK CUP

For the first time in the history of the River Thames an international boat race will take place this year for the Duke of York's International Gold trophy. The course will be over the Putney to Mortlake stretch and six laps will be covered. At present four countries have signified their intention to compete—the United States, Great Britain, Canada and France, and it is hoped that Italy and Germany also

will enter. The races are scheduled to begin June 26.

SPARROW CAUSED IT.

A sparrow today sent Ralph Hepburn, automobile racer, to a hospital and knocked him out of his chance to participate in the Spring meet recently. Hepburn was making approximately 125 miles an hour in a qualifying test when the bird collided with the goggles over his left eye. The goggles were smashed and particles of

glass under his eyelid caused him much pain and he was barely conscious when he stopped his car after his motor had forced him to drive it almost a full lap of the track.

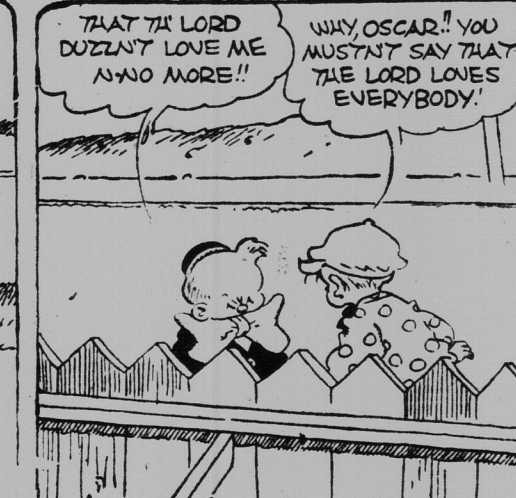

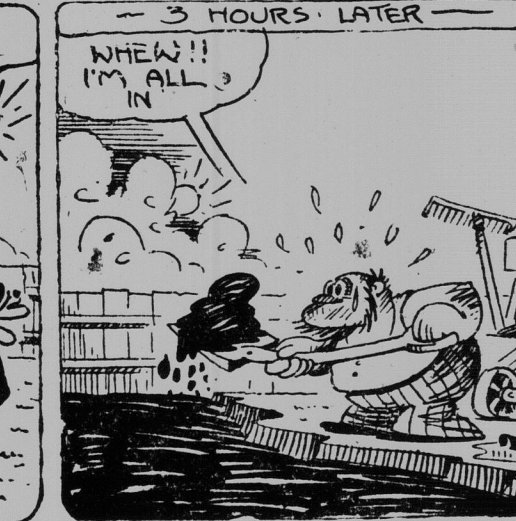
