

# KING ELECTED IN NORTH YORK


J. A. M. Armstrong, Former Conservative Member Withdrawn From the Field After Being Nominated Officially

(Canadian Press Despatch) Ottawa, Jan. 20.—The prime minister has received notification of the withdrawal of J. A. M. Armstrong from the by-election contest in North York. Notice of Mr. Armstrong's withdrawal reached the chief electoral officer this afternoon, and the returning officer for North York was thereupon instructed to declare the prime minister elected by acclamation. After receiving official confirmation of the news of his opponent's withdrawal, the prime minister sent the following message of thanks to the electors of his constituency, through W. H. Palmer, of the North York Reform Association: "The withdrawal of Mr. Armstrong having been officially announced, will you please convey to the electors of North York my sincere appreciation of the expression of their confidence and good will in re-electing me, by acclamation, as their member in the parliament of Canada. "Will you kindly give my assurance that, irrespective of party affiliations or associations, I shall seek to the utmost of my opportunity and ability, to safeguard the interests of all persons in the constituency and to advance the common good. (Sgd.) "W. L. Mackenzie King." By Saturday next all the members of the new parliament with the exception of ten, will have been gazetted. ## FIND ADVENTURE IN INVESTIGATING

Women Workers for Mothers' Allowances Face Hardships in Outlying Districts.

(Toronto Globe) Every new development in Canadian life seems to bring its own opportunities for adventure and romance and investigators for the Mothers' Allowances Act in outlying districts are finding that, even in their occupation, there is plenty of the picturesque. Miss Farncomb, Chief Inspector, revealed something of the color talk before a meeting of the Toronto Chapter, Graduate Nurses' Residence of the General Hospital. Mingled with Miss Farncomb's statistics were stories of one heroic investigator in the north, who rides in the caissons of the train from place to place, helps the men wash the dishes; has gone miles on a handcar with two Polishies for company; sleeps in railway stations, "does her work much better than a man," says Miss Farncomb, who adds, "and she isn't a nurse, either." The Chief Inspector says the work of the 17 investigators, 16 of whom are women, is greatly helped by the rural school nurse, who seconds the investigator's efforts to improve health conditions, thereby making the mother's allowance of more constructive value to her family. Beneficiaries of the fund are increasing in number rapidly, and last year's expenditure of \$775,000 will be largely exceeded in 1922. 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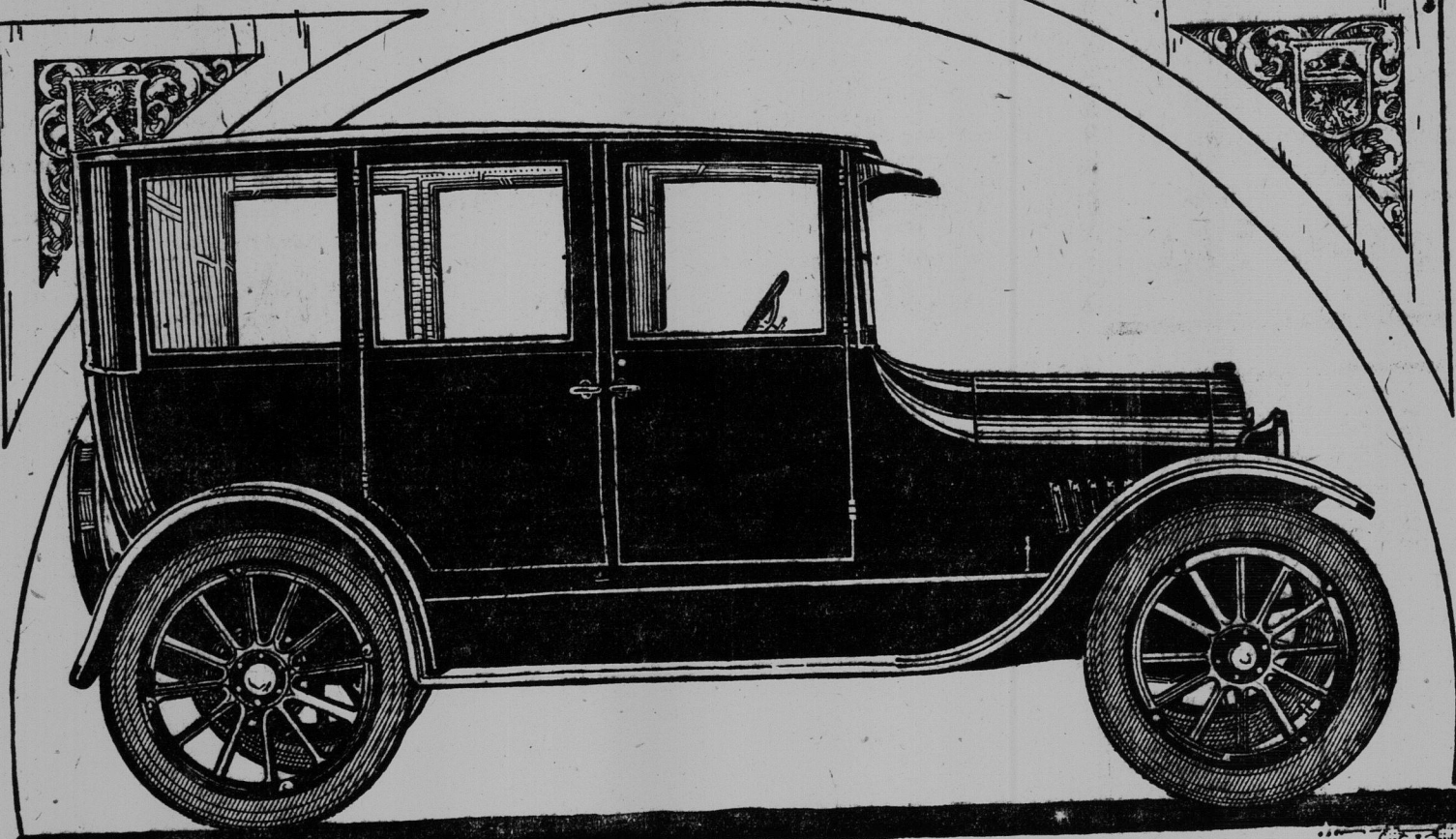



### GREAT STRIDES IN OPTOMETRY

Manner in Which Eyesight is Protected Detailed at Convention—Work of Pioneers. (Toronto Mail and Empire). Concerning human eyesight and enabling those who suffer from faulty vision to have the blessing of good eyesight restored, is a task of service which rests upon the shoulders of members of the Optometrical Association of Ontario, in convention in the Popovian Room of the King Edward Hotel, which opened yesterday with more than 300 delegates in attendance from various parts of the province. Prominent representatives of the American Association are also in attendance. The delegates were welcomed by the president, John L. Rawbon of Toronto. The president, in his annual message, stressed the fact that through the efforts of the pioneer optician practitioners of the present day have gradually developed the science of eye examining and the prescribing of glasses to a profession which by law requires an academic training. "It is wonderful to know," said Mr. Rawbon, "that through the researches of optometrists methods and instruments have been devised which make it possible to accurately examine the eyes of a young child, the deaf and dumb, the feeble-minded, the illiterate, and the aged without asking questions or resorting to the use of drugs, such as required in the pioneer days of the profession. Such an achievement should serve as an inspiration to the profession to continue these researches, bringing great benefits to manhood and womanhood of the Dominion."

### In The Modern Home



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Two New Industries. Mr. Rawbon said that the optometric profession, in recent years, has brought to Canada two new industries, with Toronto as leading optical manufacturing centre of the Dominion. By way of statistics, Mr. Rawbon said the wholesale Toronto manufacturers of optical lenses manufactured of 1,000,000 of these optical necessities, the great bulk of which were exported to France, South Africa and Australia. Speaking on "The Standardization of an Optometric Practice," Dr. R. C. Austine, of Deatur, Ill., director of the Eyesight Conservation Council of America, said that in the United States ten are wearing glasses in the United States today.
