## BAXTER HEARD IN THE COMMONS

At the morning session of the House of Commons at Ottawa yesterday Hon. J. B. M. Baxter of St. John-Albert delivered his maiden speech.

He spoke briefly in French and then in English. He said that he was glad to come from that part of the country which was so much richer by the existence of the two great races and declared that the spirit of MacDonald and Cartier still lived in the Conservative party and that such spirit would prevail in this country as soon as his party had a definite fixed policy.

## Real Campaign Speech

Mr. Baxter then went into a real campaign speech on the alleged merits of protection. "From the standpoint of the city of St. John where millions of the tax payers' money has been spent I say the time has come to do our business through Canadian ports," said Mr. Baxter.

Discussing the port of Portland, to which a large portion of Canadian shipping goes, he said: "If we are to maintain the railway burden then let us give Canadian ports and no other ports every pound of freight. I trust I will have the assurance of the government that it will cut off that stream of freight from Montreal to Portland and use the good Canadian ports of St. John and Halifax. They with others which in time will be built must be the outlet of our goods instead of the ports in the country to the south."

Mr. Baxter also demanded that the maritime provinces be given a "fair square deal" in regard to the return of natural resources to the western provinces.

Hance Logan, who followed, was given an enthusiastic reception. He reminded the speaker that they had come into the house together in 1896 and were the youngest members then in the commons. "No one in this house was more pleased than he to see him the first commoner," said Mr. Logan, who with further preliminary went into a speech on the rights of the maritime provinces in connection with the Intercolonial Railway. He reminded Mr. Baxter that it had been the Conservative party which voted down a resolution for the better protection of the maritime provinces ports.

There is not a Liberal member in this house who wants to put the Intercolonial Railway back into politics, said Mr. Logan. None want it operated again as it was a few years ago. Those who say that we are trying to put the road into political control again or to restore patronage do not know what they are talking about, but people should know the facts about the Intercolonial. The Canadian National Railways do not contain the Intercolonial and cannot because the statutes do not allow it. The Intercolonial at present through an order-in-council is operated by the Canadian Northern.

## FINE LIBRARY FOR YALE

New Building Will Cost \$2,000,000 to \$4,000,000.

New Haven, March 16.—James Gamble Rogers of New York, consulting architect of Yale University, has been in conference here with the Yale committee on Plan in regard to the university's building programme for the next few years. John V. Farwell of Chicago is chairman of the committee.

No statement was given out, but Mr. Rogers, in an interview, said that recent published accounts of Yale's building plans were "grossly exaggerated." Although most of the buildings now planned will be in Gothic architecture, Mr. Rogers said he would not recommend this as a uniform style for the university.

Mr. Rogers said the chief discussion at present concerned a proposed new

library at Yale, which will cost between \$2,000,000 and \$4,000,000. Six sites are being considered for the library. The old Divinity School, now used as a dormitory, is understood to be scheduled to be torn down to make way for a new structure.

Mr. Rogers indicated that the building programme now being considered contemplated the expenditure of about \$8,000,000.

CAPT. J. F. LINDSAY TO MONTREAL HARBOR POST

Montreal, March 16.—Word was received yesterday that the nomination of Captain J. F. Lindsay by the royal board of trade to be deputy warden of the harbor of Montreal, had been confirmed by order-in-council of the government.

Captain Lindsay has resided since 1913 in Halifax, where he has been engaged in business.

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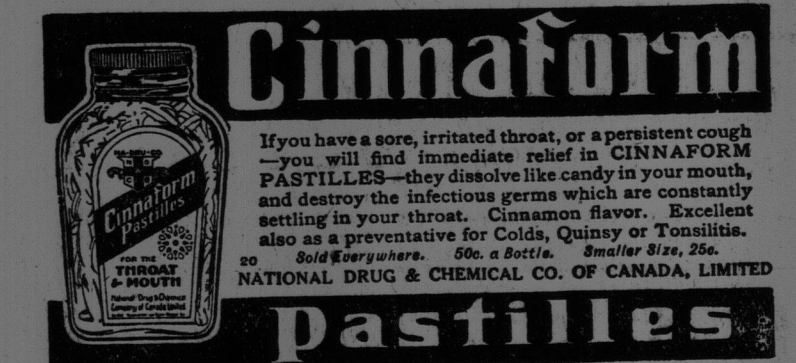
