Committee's Findings Made Public; Red Cross Disgraced in Land of Hun; Some of the Stories of Treatment of Soldiers Revolting

"He had gone down from thirteen to less than nine eight stones. I was not able to get up stairs, or by the window, or by the crowd."

Major R. F. Meidelejohn of the Royal Welch Fusiliers was despatched to what happened in the course of his journey from Cambrai to Brunswick, September 24, 1918.

"Many of the Cross women refused to say any food, calling us insulting names and spat toward us, telling us to 'go to the devil.' One English girl, 'Gracie Schweinhund,' although we told them some of us were very ill and all were wounded, German soldiers, officers and other places climbed up on the platforms of the carriages shaking their fists at us, spitting and abusing us. Some of their officers looked on, saying all English should be killed, etc. I myself saw a German officer, a young man, a German man woman dressed as nurses, and ladies, and wearing the Red Cross, deliberately climb up on the German train platform before us, saying something about giving nothing to the English and other officers among whom I understood was Captain Pelham, a German Highlander, saw Red Cross women spit in the soup before offering to help them. Thus, this same conduct of the German women, officers,

those dressed as Red Cross nurses was revolting and barbarous: beyond words, and as a result of the continuous humiliations and humiliations of the medicals, many prisoners of war besides myself have still a repugnance to seeing a nurse.

Where the conditions were made especially degrading for the medicals, they were also commensurate and allowed privileges in the matter of obtaining medical supplies. The medicals of the English prisoners thrown into trucks often lie deep in animal manure but

open and the crowd of soldiers, civilians, women and children amused themselves by throwing buckets of water over us. Any utensils which would hold water was eagerly seized, clean water, dirty water, and even urine was used."

The statement that all this savagery was in reprisal for ill-treatment of prisoners in England is scarcely worth considering. The committee refer to the recorded statement of a German general at Villers on April 17, 1918, that he knew their men were being well treated in England.
