Mr. Mayes a Genial Host and Provides Excellent Programme

G. S. Mayes, recently elected president of St. George's Society, entertained the members of the society at a most enjoyable smoking concert in Keith's assembly rooms last evening. A moving picture of a romance woven around the Charge of the Light Brigade, was then introduced, the final charge inspiring the members to the spontaneous singing of Rule Britannia, with D. A. Fox at the piano. Fred T. McKean then was heard in two patriotic songs, well rendered.

Mayor Frink was called upon and congratulated the president on the patriotic character of his entertainment and referred to the efforts of the society in fostering patriotism. He also spoke on empire defence matters.

S. H. Mayes was heard in The Old Brigade and Go to Sea. He sang in good voice and was heartily applauded.

Rev. R. A. Armstrong followed in a stirring speech, in which he dwelt on the characteristics which had made the English race and the British Empire great. This was followed by a series of pictures of old St. John in the earlier days of its history which were explained by Walter H. Golding. Refreshments were served at the close of the evening.

The old time pictures were thoroughly enjoyed. Mr. Golding gave to Clarence Ward credits for supplying the facts for his accompanying talk, which added much to the interest of the scenes. The pictures started interesting chain groups of men here and there, and many old time stories of St. John life were recalled.

It was the unanimous vote of all that Mr. Mayes had given the members and guests a truly delightful evening and the proceedings closed with the national anthem and cheers for the society's president.

Daily Hints For the Cook

MRS G'S GINGERBREAD
One-half cup sugar creamed with 1 tablespoon shortening, 1/2 cup molasses, salt, 1 cup sour milk with 1 teaspoon soda dissolved in it, 1 teaspoon ginger, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon extract of lemon, 2 cups sifted flour.

CORN BREAD
One cup granulated cornmeal, 1 cup flour, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 cup milk, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 cup melted butter. Mix soft and bake in rather quick oven.

GRAHAM MUFFINS
One teaspoon flour, 1/2 teaspoon graham flour, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup milk, piece of butter size of egg melted. Add the butter last thing.
